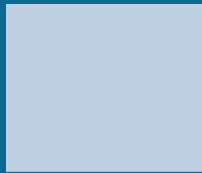
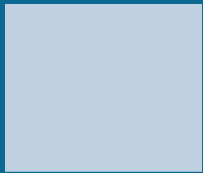


BALTIMORE'S CHALLENGE Housing for All

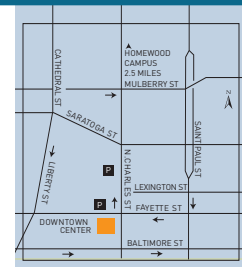
